

Book Report Ideas

1	Write a five paragraph book report.
2	Make a roll-movie of your book (use a shoe box).
3	Dress up as one of the characters in your story and come and tell the class what it was like having the experiences in the story.
4	Make a diorama of your favorite scene from the book.
5	Write a letter to one of the characters asking questions about the exciting events.
6	Give a puppet show to illustrate the story.
7	Read and record part of the story on a tape recorder or video camera and play it for the class. Explain why you chose the part.
8	Make a model of something from the story and tell the class why you liked the story.
9	Broadcast your book review to a radio audience. Don't forget sound effects. Use a tape recorder, a video camera, etc.
10	Make a map showing where the story takes place. Describe what happens at each spot.
11	Put on a shadow play of a scene from your book.
12	Paint a mural showing scenes from your book.
13	Make some funny awards to give to the people in your book such as the author, characters, and illustrator.
14	Write a song about the book and sing it for the class.
15	Design a bulletin board to share your book.
16	Make a table display about your book and share it with the class.
17	Write a different ending to the story. Tell why you like your ending better.
18	Write a poem about the book.
20	Make a crossword puzzle or wordsearch for the class. Use words, characters, and places from the book.
21	Make a collage with pictures, materials, and objects that tell about your book.
22	Do a summary of the story in comic strip form. Be sure to use captions to explain the action.
23	Make a series of at least four pictures about your book. Put titles on each picture.
24	Make a life size picture of your favorite character.
25	Make a mobile of parts of your book.
26	Write a letter to the author of your book explaining your favorite part of the book and why it was your favorite part.

Note: Except for #1, you can only use an idea for one book report
